Happy New Year!

By the time you're reading this, you have probably shared all the holiday cheer with your family and friends for another year: gathering to share meals, giving and receiving gifts, lifting your voices in song, and many of the other traditions along the way. As relatively new pastors with a new baby, my wife Leah and I are learning what will work for us to find time with family while sharing in worship with so many beloved folks at the congregations we serve. Whether you're a pastor or not, whether young or old, it often feels like there's never enough time in the Christmas season.

I remember growing up, my parents hurrying us from one end of Nebraska to the other to see relatives on each side of the family tree, and then returning to our home in the Cedar Rapids area to savor those last moments before the break would be over and we'd return to school, maybe wearing some of those new socks grandma had gotten us - or maybe telling friends on the playground about new toys or baseball bats or other exciting gifts that we got that year. However the mood felt, there was always bound to be a teacher or someone older at church who would ask the question we thought about every year: did you get everything you wanted for Christmas this year?

I remember the joy I would have telling a person about the exciting bigger gifts I got, those times when Santa really listened and got us exactly what we wanted. I remember the years where there was some disappointment because the rest of my family seemed so satisfied to get together and play cribbage while I was going to have to go back to school and tell my friends I didn't get the Nintendo 64 all of them got. Of course, I also can think back and remember the memories of playing games and sharing laughter with my grandparents on the last Christmases I shared with them while they were alive.

In the Christmas season, we always have such great joy, but with it can come a rush of other emotions. As we head into the new year ahead (or maybe you're already reading this in 2024), we have hopes for new goals we are setting, plans for our church life together, and wishes for our family, community, and world. The hope we have found in the Word made Flesh, Jesus, born for us this Christmas season is a hope we can share with the whole world. In the face of division and despair around us, we look to a shining star just as the Magi (or wise men) did all those years ago. We look on with hope, even in the face of things that seem hopeless.

As I ponder the Good News of Christ's birth, I remember what happens immediately after it in Matthew 2:12-20: how there are dreams of terror and then a massacre of innocent infants, how Joseph and Mary flee to Egypt to live in exile through the remainder of Herod's life, how nothing seemed particularly safe for the baby Jesus. In the midst of these trying times, where we hear of war in the Holy Land and even find Christ in the rubble (look up "Christmas Lutheran Church" in Bethlehem to learn more), we are reminded that God finds us, God comes to us even (especially?) when we are at our most devastated.

No matter what you got or didn't get on your list this year for Christmas, I hope that you will continue to dream with me: to dream of the ways that God shows up here at Trinity Lutheran Church and around the Quad Cities, to ponder the ways our year ahead might shine the light of Christ in this weary world, and to join the dreams of our ancestors for the hope that we find only in Christ. As we look forward to the hope we have, may we remember those who are finding themselves hopeless, and bring the presence of Christ's peace to them through all we do.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

At the December meeting, Pastor Stephen's message came from a devotional book titled. "Ordinary Blessings for Christmas Season" that was for church employees. It was also very applicable to church volunteers. The message was that December is a good time to reflect on what has been done and not yet done. While it is always easy to focus on what didn't get accomplished during the year, my preference is to celebrate our successes and accomplishments that Trinity experienced. One of those accomplishments is the success of the 2023 budget. If you recall, at the 2023 annual meeting, a budget of \$172,639 was approved. The budget anticipated church collections of \$158,600. That budget was actually a deficit budget of just over \$14,000. Thanks to everyone's diligent efforts in 2023 on the expense side, and generous financial offerings on the giving side, we will have church collections that exceeded \$158,600. Expenses in 2023 will also come in below the \$172,639. I am excited to announce that Stewardship and Council will be presenting a budget at the Annual Congregational Meeting on January 28th that is very close to exactly balanced. The final touches are being put on it, but at the December council meeting we were looking at a budget that was a surplus by right around \$100.00. This budget also contemplates some expenditures to grow programs that are important to Trinity.

We also anticipate that we will be bringing forth a plan for a new sign out front of Trinity. Stay tuned for more details as Property and Council work through the financials of a beautiful sign that will be able to communicate the events and happenings that occur at Trinity to all that drive by. I believe the new sign will be one of the larger accomplishments for Trinity in 2024. As 2023 comes to a close, I hope you are as excited as I am to see what lies ahead for Trinity in 2024.


