Greetings Good Folks of Trinity,

Even in the busy rush toward Holy Week and Easter, I have been looking forward to some of the readings on the horizon in the Easter season. You can find these readings in the later pages of this newsletter, but one in particular feels fitting. It is a story we'll hear on Sunday, April 7, with the early followers of Christ having been stirred by the Holy Spirit and learning to live together as fellow disciples:

"Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need." — Acts 4:32-35, NRSV

The early Christian community was one of extreme mutuality, holding "everything in common." The resurrection of Christ allowed them to boldly share! That might seem like a very foreign concept to us now, when we have ingrained individualistic attitudes and ideals in almost every aspect of life. It feels counter-cultural to share so much, but how does God call us to hold things in common these days? In living the resurrection life, how might we let go of our need for control over time, money, prestige and power, and share it as a community of faith in new ways?

We start by asking questions like these. For every open-ended question that sparks imagination for another way we might share some of what we hold in common and help our neighbor, there will be some that can creatively engage with that question, listen for the Holy Spirit, and lead this congregation (or any group, for that matter) into some new ministry in our community. Others will follow in behind, and a few may even question "why would we do that?!"

We do <u>that</u> (whatever that is that fills in the blank) so we can live out Christ's mandate we celebrate on Maundy Thursday: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." - John 13:34-35, NRSV

Those ways that we love one another just as Christ has loved us may make us feel uncomfortable. Remember, Jesus washed the feet and fed Judas and Peter, knowing that they would betray and deny him. These can be little things: working to collect food or resettlement supplies, serving in worship where we are gathered in the Holy Spirit to praise God and be sent forth to share Christ's love, helping with Sunday School or our upcoming Day Camp, cleaning up around the building and property on Spring Clean-Up Day so we have a clean, safe space to use for all these aspects of ministry, and so much more.

I was reminded recently that many people (myself included) often need that first ask to know that they are needed for something. In that vein, we will be distributing Time and Talents surveys soon so that we can learn what skills and what ways we might share and hold all these things in common. If you've never participated in this before, I welcome you to ask questions if you have any. If you've done this numerous times, I invite you to try this like it is your first time, perhaps asking yourself: What might God be calling me to do here in this place at this time? These actions do not have to be the most daunting, overwhelming things, but they just might help to change the world through this sharing.



# April 2024 – From Sheep to Shepherd: An LSI Early Childhood Services Story

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, a mother, recently released from treatment, found herself in her new empty apartment with her son. She felt lost and needed a shepherd to guide her. So, Hali contacted LSI's Early Childhood Services, and Gretchen O'Brien, a Family Support Worker, answered the call. Gretchen began virtual home visits using the Healthy Family America home-visiting model. For the next three years, Gretchen connected Hali and her son to community resources, served as a support system and a shoulder to cry on, and celebrated Hali's sobriety milestones with her. Even when Hali doubted herself, Gretchen guided and believed in her.

"I just remember sitting in that empty apartment crying, but I had Gretchen on the phone. You guys believed in me when nobody else did," shared Hali.

Today, Hali serves on the Healthy Family America (HFA) National Parent Advisory Committee, the first of its kind. The group is composed of 10-12 parents from around the country who have graduated from their local HFA program, each participant with their own story to share. Hali needed a shepherd in her time of trouble and self-doubt, and Gretchen answered that call. Now, Hali serves as a shepherd to thousands of parents through the National Parent Advisory Committee. The LSI Early Childhood team couldn't be more proud of Hali and Gretchen.
